First Actuarial Analysis of Pakistan's Sehat Sahulat Programme (SSP)

Abstract of Session:

Since 2015, Sehat Sahulat Programme (SSP)¹, an initiative of Pakistan's Federal, Provincial and Regional Governments, has been working to provide financial protection to poor families against catastrophic health expenditure. SSP currently operates in 38 districts of Pakistan, covering over 3.2 million families. The first of its kind in the country, the Programme provides inpatient care to those living below the poverty line of US \$2 per day. Since inception, the Programme has been supported by the German Ministry for Economic Development and Cooperation through GIZ's² Pak-German bilateral project "Support to Social Protection-Social Health Protection (SP-SHP)".

The objectives of this webinar are to:

- Learn about the wider healthcare system in Pakistan, giving the country context
- Learn about SSP's journey to date, who the key stakeholders are and GIZ's motivation for support
- Show the results of the **first actuarial analysis** of the Programme (as at 2018), uncovering some of the key uncertainties that lie ahead. This is important in ensuring the long-term financial and political viability of the programme.

By providing objective tools for understanding health insurance data, actuarial analysis contributes to financial risk management, aiding administrators, managers and decision makers. Used proactively, these types of analysis can help steer public health schemes towards sustainability and contribute towards Universal Health Coverage. The approach discussed can be applied to any health insurance/risk pooling mechanism.
